

Fire Station Craft Activity

When children cut, colour and glue, they are learning a lot without even realising it. Using scissors, pencils, and glue helps build their hand strength and coordination. They also practice thinking skills by figuring out what goes where and following steps in order. While working on their fire station, they start to understand what firefighters do and why fire stations are important in our communities. Talking about the project helps build their vocabulary and confidence.

You will need:

Printable Fire Station Sheets (on card)

Coloured Pencils, Crayons or Pens

Scissors

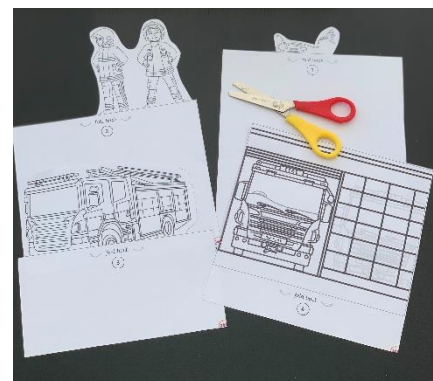
Glue



Instructions:

Step 1: Print out the fire station sheets.

Once printed, carefully cut out the pieces., They may enjoy helping with this step, but may need some assistance depending on their age.



Step 2: Colour each of the pieces in.



Step 3: Fold along the solid lines following the arrows on page one.



Step 4: Fold page two. Add glue to the underside and stick to page one.



Step 5: Repeat for pages three and four.



Step 6: Page four is the final piece and forms the background of the pack.



This activity could be extended further by exploring other emergency services and what they do to help us, storytelling, and imaginative play. These are all ways to support your child's learning through creativity and fun.
