

Post Office Postcard Craft

At our 360 Play Street, children can visit the Post Office and send letters just like grown-ups. This activity lets your child create their own postcard at home, inspired by their time playing on the 360 Street.

This activity helps children recognise colours, practise matching, and develop fine motor skills through writing and drawing.

You will need:

Printable Postcards (on card)
Printable Postage Stamps (on card)
Coloured Pencils, Crayons or Pens
Scissors
Glue



Instructions:

Step 1: Print out the postcards and the Postage stamps.



Step 2: Cut around each of the Postcards and postage stamps. This maybe a job for a grown up.



Step 3: It is now time to match your postcards and postage stamps. Look at the stamp and say the colour. Find the postcard that is the same colour.



Step 4: Glue the correct colour stamps to the corner of your postcard.



Step 5: Draw a picture or share your favourite part of playing at 360 Play.
Grown-ups can help write the message.



Talk together about the colours used and who the postcard could be sent to. This supports colour recognition, communication, and imaginative role play.
