360 Play has the opportunity to support Squirrels, Beavers and Cubs with activities that link to the Scouts Programme and selected activity Badges. Through active play, imaginative role play, creativity, problem solving and teamwork, children can develop skills while enjoying their group visit.

This guide is designed to help leaders identify opportunities throughout the centre that could support their programme and make badge activities part of an exciting group day out. Leader guidance will still be required throughout the visit to ensure all individual badge requirements and programme elements are completed in full.

Whether you're planning a unit outing, working towards programme themes or simply looking for a fun way to bring everyone together, 360 Play offers an exciting environment where Squirrels, Beavers and Cubs can play, explore and develop skills together.

Squirrels Activity Badges

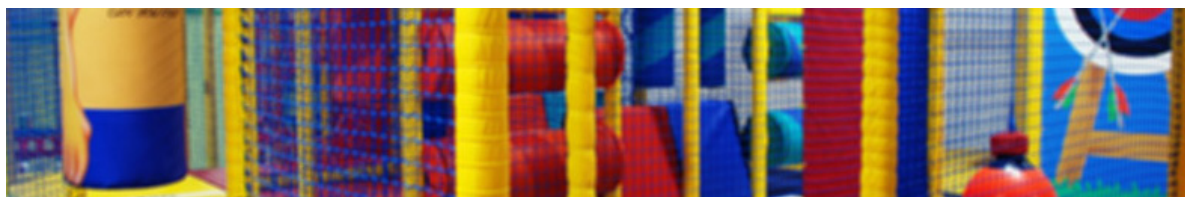
ALL ABOUT ME / FEEL GOOD

Twirl's Boutique gives Squirrels a fun role play setting to explore confidence, emotions and what makes each of them unique. Explore Twirls Boutique and encourage Squirrels to recognise different emotions, share something they are proud of and choose positive words to describe themselves. Squirrels may like to practice positive affirmations in our affirmation mirrors.

Feel Good activities could encourage Squirrels to identify things that make them feel good, practice saying something positive about themselves and think about ways they can help somebody else feel good too.

GET ACTIVE

360 Play provides plenty of opportunities for Squirrels to get moving through climbing, crawling, balancing, exploring and active play. Encourage the Squirrels to complete different movement activities around the playframe and discuss how this makes their bodies feel afterwards.

Beaver Activity Badges

HEALTH AND FITNESS

The Health and Fitness Activity Badge creates a strong opportunity to use physical elements of 360 Play.

Beavers could take part in an active challenge around the playframe, exploring different types of movement and physical activity. Activities could include climbing, balancing, crawling and completing a set route before thinking about why physical activity is important and how exercise affects their bodies. Ask them if they notice changes such as breathing faster, feeling warmer or their hear beating more quickly after active play.

BUILDER

Build It, Break It provides a natural environment for Beavers to explore construction, design, problem solving and building.

A Builder Badge Adventure could challenge Beavers to plan something they want to build, think about the materials and shapes they need, construct their idea and test whether it works. Once it is built, encourage them to look at their creation and decide what they could change to make it better.

COOK

Luigi's Pizzeria provides an opportunity to explore food, kitchens and the different skills involved in preparing meals through role play.

Beavers could explore ingredients, design their own pizza, think about balanced food choices and learn about basic food preparation and kitchen safety. The Pizzeria can provide a starting point for conversations about balanced choices, preparing food and staying safe in the kitchen.



Cubs Activity Badges

ARTIST

Messy Play could support creative activities for Cubs through drawing, painting, designing and making.

Children should see what activities we have in our Messy Play area and be encouraged to develop their own idea before creating a finished piece. Ask them about the choice they made during the process and to describe their finished masterpiece.

PERSONAL SAFETY

360 Street provides an interesting environment for exploring everyday safety. Children could identify potential risks around different environments, discuss road and fire safety and explore what they should do in an emergency.

Visit the Fire Station and use our parent prompts to encourage Cubs to think about emergency services and how to respond safely in different situations. Lead discussions with who they might need to contact, what information they may need to provide and what they would do in each emergency situation.

TEAMWORK

Teamwork is one of the strongest opportunities for older children visiting 360 Play.

Encourage cubs to complete a series of tasks around the centre that require communication, problem solving and working together. For example, teams could be challenged to build something together in Build It, Break It, solve a problem on 360 Street or complete a group challenge.

The emphasis should be on listening to others, sharing ideas, taking responsibility and achieving something together.
